Operations Update



Thickeners Demolition Project

Due to structural damage and safety concerns Freeport decided to demolish the thickeners:

- Thickeners #1 and #2 demolition complete
- Thickener #3 demolition permit is being reviewed by ADOT

Highway 92 Construction Work

Construction work along Highway 92 is now complete. This work consisted of removing the existing asphalt pavement, installing a new waterline crossing, restoring asphalt pavement and reinstallation of the pavement striping.

Fence Repair

Freeport is in the process of replacing the damaged fence around the pit. Materials have been procured. We are awaiting ADOT's review of the previously submitted permit application.

Upcoming Projects

Freeport expects to conduct an engineering study to facilitate a highwall slope stabilization project. More about this project will be shared at the 2025 Q1 CPP.

Soil Remediation Update

Freeport continues work on the Bisbee/Douglas Soil Remediation programs:

Douglas

- Repository and staging area work to begin in December
- Work in yards anticipated to begin in Q1 2025
- To date, 23 parcels exceed cleanup levels, and we are working to obtain property access

Bisbee

- o Repository and staging area work to begin in January
- Work in yards anticipated to begin 2Q or 3Q2025
- o To date, 19 parcels exceed cleanup levels, and we are working to obtain access

Biodiversity Update

Freeport-McMoRan employees recently participated in Biodiversity Week. This initiative celebrates nature and local wildlife and provides an opportunity to educate students on the importance of bats in the ecosystem. It has evolved into many lessons and activities aimed at helping the next generation better understand the importance of biodiversity.



Economic Impact

Freeport-McMoRan's Arizona operations generated almost **\$4.4 billion** in economic benefits for the state in 2023. Arizona operations employed **10,296** and the ripple effect of wages and taxes, plus services we purchased, created **35,527** jobs in the state, generating additional economic benefits.

- Boys and Girls Club (\$37,000): Project F.U.N. (Facility Upgrade Needs)


- City of Bisbee (\$56,000): Enhancing transparency and civic engagement by installing essential audio-visual equipment in the new city hall building council chambers
- City Of Douglas (\$35,000): Sustaining mobility ensuring self-sufficient public transit for Douglas and surrounding communities.


